On March 5th, team members Stefan Hewitt, Nicholas Rybczuk, Steven French, and Shaun Moore headed to New York City to represent the U of M at the Annual Munich Re Cup. Here's what they had to say about their experience...



What was your favourite part?

Shaun: Building many spreadsheets and models to test and manipulate. I was able to utilize data provided in the case, in class learning, and internship experience.

Steven: Getting together with my teammates and seeing how much progress we made as a group. **Stefan:** Growing in camaraderie with my fellow teammates. The experience of growing with and challenging each other taught us a lot and brought our the best in us which helped us make a winning presentation.

Nick: That I was able to look at a problem and solve it using things I've actually learned in university. It was an amazing feeling to work on such a big project as well rather than what I'm used to; endless Coaching Actuaries questions.

The most challenging part?

Shaun: External research and transitioning from the paralysis by analysis stage. I was dealing with an unfamiliar concept that was also new to the industry which allowed for a wide range of innovation. Examples of research included industry, insurance regulations, medical studies, and articles to support our solution.

Steven: Coordinating working and meeting times as well as solo work.

Stefan: Finding the balance between displaying all the intricate work we put into our solution and presenting the higher-level picture that correlated with the case.

Nick: Finding the balance between putting in the amount of work that I felt was necessary to win the competition and my regular life.

Advice to future participants?

Shaun: Focus on the big picture, communicating your idea, and supporting your idea with the necessary measurements. Continuously practice and dedicate hours, don't be afraid to think outside the box, and be open to revision and feedback:)

Steven: Organize your time well and be aware you wont have time to do everything. Stefan: Be prepared for the amount of work. It's not a small commitment. It takes sacrifice and a lot of time spent in uncomfortable places to help you grow. Nick: Don't get muddled in the details and look at the big picture.

How did you prepare for the competition?

Everyone: The competition was spread over 4 months with the first 3 dedicated to building an executive report and the final for creating a presentation deck.

We prepared by learning each of our strengths, delegating responsibility, and creating goals. We learned to understand our learning styles to determine a plan that worked best for the group. A group chat was created, numerous meetings were held, long days worked, and we each likely put in 250+ hours. Constructive criticism was key so we held numerous practices for our presentation to rehearse and improve our delivery and slides.

Feedback from industry professionals was heavily implemented and vital to our growth during both stages of the competition. We conducted lots of external research to go beyond case minimums to differentiate ourselves from the competition and become as knowledgeable as possible with our solution, the case, and industry.


Favourite thing about NYC?

Nick: The best thing about New York was hands down the steakhouse. Never in my life have I had a meal like that, and although it was pricey oh man was it good!



What does it take to do Munich Re?

Everyone: To do Munich Re you need a team that is determined, passionate and driven. Every member needs to be accountable for their roles and responsibilities.

What made our group so effective was that by the end of the competition, we were all brothers and a family. You need to be able to make sacrifices and prioritize your schedule. Balancing with classes and actuary exams can get difficult so learning new study strategies is an asset.

Having some type of foundation is also a big advantage and this can be in the form of exams passed, actuary classes taken or internships completed.

YEARS IN SCHOOL








Average Number of Co-op Terms 2.90 for students with FT employment


Average Number of Exams for 3.27 students with FT employment




